USGA Rules govern all play.

- Out of bounds marked by white stakes or fence posts. The Driving Range is out of bounds.
- Yardage markers measured to the center of the greens. Blue = 200, White = 150, Red = 100.
- There are drop zones on all par 3's for balls hit in the water hazard.
- Balls on wood chips outside a hazard are in play. There is no relief without penalty.
- Relief without penalty provided for a ball inside the planter beside the back nine restroom.



Observed 18 hole playing time is 4:30



Waiahole Ditch, Built 1913-1916

Hole #11 featuring the Waiahole Ditch:

The Waiahole Ditch was built by the Oahu Sugar Company between 1913 and 1916 to provide irrigation for the pineapple and sugar cane plantations of central Oahu. Though sugar cane is no longer grown on Oahu, the ditch continues to provide irrigation to local farmers and the Mililani Golf Club. The 25.3 mile waterway begins in the Kahana Valley diverting 10 million gallons of water a day from the windward side of the Koolau Mountain Range (and an aquifer in the mountain) through the Oahu plains and ends in the Ewa Basin.



Hole #17 featuring Albizia Trees:

Native to Africa, the albizia tree was brought to the islands in 1917 as an ornamental tree and for reforestation purposes. The albizia is one of the fastest growing trees in the world and towers over 6 of our 18 holes at up to 130 feet (#4).

BACKGROUND PHOTO:

Hole #2 featuring Mount Kaala:

The Waianae Mountain Range is Oahu's oldest area of volcanic activity and has the island's highest peak, Mount Kaala at 4025 feet. The golf course elevation varies by only 36 feet, the 8th green the high point at 701 feet, and in front of the 13th green the low point at 665 feet.
